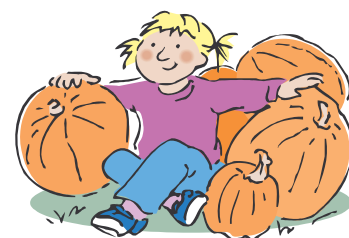

- **Tracking Volunteer Hours:** Please record the time you spend helping out at the center or doing projects at home in the Parent Volunteer Logs located outside each classroom. The class with the most volunteer hours per quarter gets a \$25 gift certificate to buy books for the class. A memo was sent home in the cubbies a few weeks ago that gives you some ideas for volunteer projects. Policy Review

Please keep in mind that there are certain operational policies that are in place to help make MudPies run smoother. These policies must be adhered to by all families. Here is a short review of some of them.

- TUITION PAYMENTS:

Tuition payments are due by Thursday morning, 9:00am. If payments are not received by this time, a \$10.00 late fee will be assessed to your account.

If you choose to pay monthly or bi-weekly, tuition payments are to be made at the beginning of the month and at least 2 weeks in advance. No account can be in arrears more than 1 week.

If your child receives subsidized payments (Smart Start or DSS) you have a weekly fee instead of a monthly fee. If you are not sure what your weekly fee is, please see one of the office staff. These families are still required to have their account balance paid up front and not run in arrears or late fees will also be assessed.

- HOURS OF OPERATION:

MudPies hours of operation are from 7:00am – 6:00pm. Do NOT drop off children before 7:00am. An after-hours late fee will be assessed if you pick up your child after 6:00pm!

- SIGN IN – SIGN OUT:

Remember to sign your child in upon arrival and out when you pick them up in the afternoons.

- MEDICINE:

Medicines are given one time a day, between 11:00am – 12:00 noon. Over the counter medicines cannot be given without a note from your child's doctor! Prescription medicines must be in the original container with the prescription label on. Parents must provide their own dispenser to administer the medicine.

- CLOTHING CHANGES:

Children are required to have at least one complete change of clothes in their cubbies at all times. Many classrooms prefer at least 2 sets.

- ILLNESS POLICY:

MudPies will contact you and ask that you pick up your child if he or she becomes ill during the day. **IF YOUR CHILD IS SENT HOME DUE TO ILLNESS, THE CHILD MUST STAY AT HOME THE FOLLOWING DAY BEFORE RETURNING TO MUDDIES!**

- FOOD POLICY:

Food is not to be brought into the center except for the following reasons: an allergy that would prevent your child from eating the food served at the center or classroom activities or parties.

- BOTTLES, SIPPY CUPS, and FOOD must be LABELED and DATED!

If there are ever any questions about any operational policies, please feel free to write them down and drop them in the check box. We will try to address all questions/concerns in the next month's newsletter.

The Parent Express “Connecting home and school”

Reading to Preschoolers

Studies have shown that important factors in a child's school success are sharing books with adults and being read to from a very young age. Choosing books that are appropriate in format and sharing them in age-appropriate ways creates a positive experience and fosters a love of reading.

Cuddling with a preschooler and sharing a one-on-one reading time reconnects you with your active, independent young child. Make this a special time. Find a quiet, cozy reading nook. Establish a routine and read every day at the same time. If you can't be there at that time for some reason, ask the person who is caring for your child to take your place. Before you share the book with your child, take a few minutes to read it through to be sure that your child will enjoy it.

Additional tips for sharing a book with your preschooler

- Always hold the book so that your child can see as you read. Or let your child hold the book.
- As you read, move your finger along under the words. This helps your child make the connection between the words he sees on the page and the words you are reading.
- Read at a slow pace. Children like to take time to really look at the illustrations. Pictures are important because they tell a large part of the story.
- Talk while sharing a book. Ask your child about the characters and their actions. Point out interesting things in the illustrations.
- Children love “dramatic readings” with voices full of expression. Use different voices for the characters and exaggerate the rhythm and rhyme of the words.
- When you have finished reading, take time to share thoughts about the book. Your preschooler may want to tell you something, ask you questions, or go back to certain pages. Relax and enjoy the experience.
- Sometimes your preschooler may want to be the “reader.” Children read stories they have memorized. Sometimes they like to make up funny new versions. Encourage these important pre-reading skills.

Following your child's lead will keep story time a pleasant, happy experience.

As fall weather is quickly approaching, please check your child's cubby for weather appropriate clothing. You should also bring in a light jacket (labeled with their name). We welcome Vonda Williams to our classroom. Please let us know if you have questions or concerns.

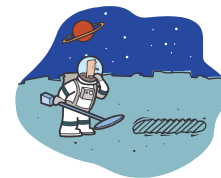
Dino-mytes
